This sheet applies to Mr Stroud and Mr Sanghera's Classes

Structure of the course:

The NEW GCSE course is assessed on a 9-1 scale.

Coursework is worth 60 % of marks- this is the work that is generated in lessons and at home.

Exam is worth 40% Exam is 10 hours in the second year, usually around Easter-students will have 12 weeks to prepare for this, and is done in controlled assessment conditions- students usually receive exam paper after Christmas break.

Year 11 Check list

For coursework project and exam.

A01 – Developing an idea from a starting point (artist research)

A range of artists studies (3-7) that have influenced your work both visually and thematically.

Your work can be influenced by a larger number of artists but you must ensure that they are relevant to your theme.

You need to analyse your work which is demonstrated through purposeful annotation.

A02 - Refining ideas through experimentation with different media

Experiment with a range of techniques ensuring the is clear impact from you chosen artists.

The techniques may include:

- Collage
- Photoshop techniques
- Print making (stencils, monoprints, lino)
- Creating layers in a photo

You need produce high quality work by:

- Using different viewpoints
- Creating strong compositions
- Using contrasts
- Taking care and showing dedication

You will need to annotate your work to explain your thoughts and ideas.

A03 - Recording ideas.

You will need to gather a range of **primary images** to develop your ideas. When gathering this primary evidence you will need to show that you have considered the composition. You may have used Rule of Thirds, leading lines or negative space.

From this, you will need to print contact sheets and circle the images you will develop further.

You are required to draw your ideas. This could be sketching out photo composition ideas or drawing on Rule of Thirds grids.

You will need to annotate your work to explain your thoughts and ideas. \\

A04 – Outcomes

A final piece(s) that follows the theme of your project. This is usually a larger piece and should conclude your ideas. It can be a single piece or a range of pieces.

You must show links to your portfolio of work.

Other Important information

Students now need annotate their work.

Students create artist and photographer studies to show that they can critically engage with subject.

Also, drawing is an essential component of the course. Drawing could be sketching compositions out, as well as observational drawing onto photographs.
