Explore how Oscar Wilde uses language and structure to display his feelings about the conditions of children in prison

Oscar Wilde displays his frustration about the conditions of children in prison, which is reflected in the quote "To him the horrible thing is to be there at all. In the eyes of humanity it should be a horrible thing for him to be there at all." This use of repetition shows how angry he is that children are treated like this, reinforced by the word "should". The use of the simple sentence at the beginning reflects how strong his anger is as well.
